

## Senior Citizens of Reynoldsburg (SCOR) 2013 Annual Report

### Overview:

2013 has been a transformative year for SCOR. Ranging from our staff, to our activities and to our members, we are excited for the positive outcomes that have resulted from these various changes.

Under the direction of our new Parks and Recreation Director, Joe Brown, SCOR has adopted new business hours in order to become more convenient for our members. These hours have been extended Monday, Wednesday and Friday, and we have also added Saturday to our schedule!

After 24 years as Director, Jenny Walsh decided to step down and work as a part-time Assistant Director. Her position was filled by the past Assistant Director, Judy Doran. A second Assistant Director opportunity opened up and was filled by Kris Johnson. Her time with us, however, was short-lived due to another career opportunity. Eileen Lawson was then promoted from Recreational Aide to Assistant Director. Later on, Cindy McComb was hired as our new Recreational Aide.

In comparison to last year, overall membership decreased by .061%, with a drop of .065% in the women population, and a drop of .052% from our male members. This minor reduction is partially attributed to the cleansing of our database to ensure that we rid of any unnecessary data and increase accuracy.

## **Renovations:**

As an ever-changing facility, the SCOR building has undergone many modifications in order to improve the conditions for our members.

*Building:* We have made numerous changes to the building, some of which are to promote the safety of the facility. Under new direction, all of the locks to the building have been changed and the hot water tank has been replaced. Additionally, some of the parking has been moved, creating more handicap parking spaces, making it more convenient for more of our members. Minor changes have also been implemented, such as the addition of clocks in each room, adding coat hooks, ridding of the faulty health monitor, removing the wall borders, relocating the bulletin boards, removing and washing the display quilts, deep-cleaning the kitchen, painting and cleaning the offices, and organizing all of the cabinets.

*Activities:* Our members enjoy the numerous activities that SCOR has to offer, and we want to make sure that they are provided with the very best. We understand the importance of maintaining the conditions of the supplies that are used, and have worked towards their upkeep. One of the major improvements was with the BINGO board, where we have ordered new balls, reconditioned and added a camera to the console, and received a new flasher board with a verifier unit. Other major changes include the re-felting of the pool tables, new mahjongg tables, new card tables, and the semi-annual tuning of the piano. We have also made additions for our newer activities, such as, a new bocce court, a Ping-Pong table for the billiard table, and horseshoe pits.

Many of our activities have been embraced by our members. Due to the popularity of our recreational activities, we have composed a daily schedule that will allow everybody to enjoy them on a regular basis.

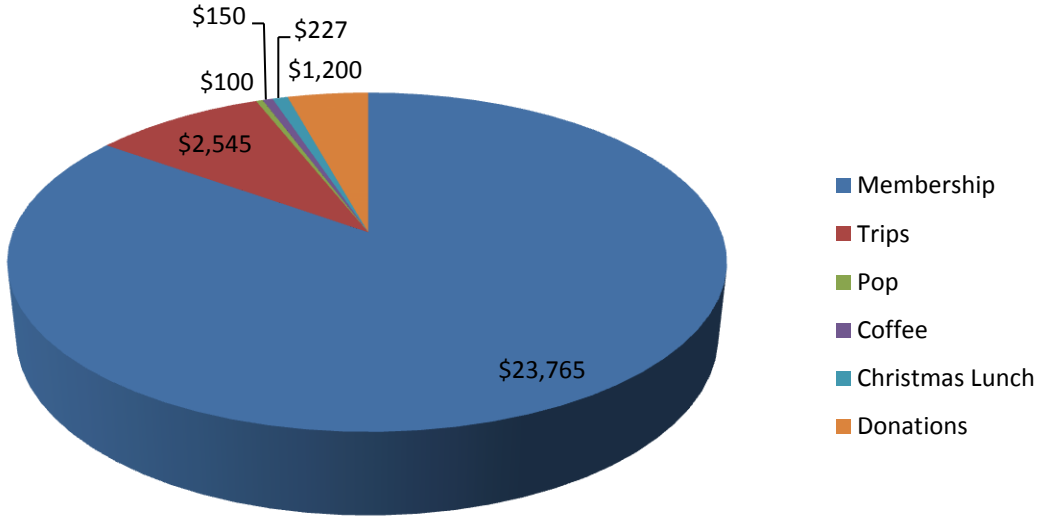
