

Senior Citizens of Reynoldsburg (SCOR) 2014 Annual Report

Overview:

As 2014 comes to a close, we reflect on SCOR's progress in becoming a premier senior facility. We have experienced new additions, loss, and many changes, all of which participated in the growth and development of our center.

After over 24 years of service as Director and Assistant Director, Jenny Walsh retired from SCOR. Our Recreational Aide, Cindy McComb also left our center, leaving two vacant positions. Laura Young filled the position of Recreational Aide, and left shortly thereafter. Peggy Gordon was hired as Assistant Director, but left during her onboarding process to pursue a full-time opportunity. Both positions are now filled, with Krystal Payne as one of the part-time Assistant Directors and Annie Decker as the part-time Recreational Aide. Judy Doran remains as Director and Eileen Lawson is continuing as a part-time Assistant Director.

In an attempt to grow with an already technologically advanced society, SCOR utilizes our new TV and laptop to project an informational PowerPoint that provides the daily schedule and important updates. We have also updated our database software so that we can offer our members the option to receive their newsletter by email. Postage for newsletters that are continuing to be mailed has been switched to be paid by the City of Reynoldsburg. The city has also started accepting the membership dues in place of SCOR to continue funding the operation of the building. Our director, Judy, installed a new documentation system where we have started writing receipts for both membership and SCOR trips. This allows us to easily manage the finances and reassures SCOR's professional accountability. The Annual Report has also been included in this new system and grants us the ability to evaluate our past activity.

In comparison to last year, overall membership increased by .008%, with an increase of .006% in the women population, and an increase of .01% from our male members. This is an improvement from last year's comparison. The increase seems minor which can be partially attributed to the time the data was extracted and to the continuation of the cleansing of our database to ensure that we rid of any unnecessary data and increase accuracy.

Renovations:

As an ever-changing facility, the SCOR building has undergone many modifications in order to improve the conditions for our members.

Building: Thanks to the persistence of our previous Parks and Recreation Director, Joe Brown, our biggest on-going project was finally approved. We were able to have our parking lot replaced, complete with pavers and water flow draining. Additionally, a ramp was installed for our back deck in order to increase handicap accessibility. To complement our new look, two benches were purchased with money from a memory donation and shelves were built inside the storage shed. The completion of the parking lot was celebrated by a ribbon-cutting ceremony. Aside from the external renovations, we have also made interior changes, such as concealing electrical wires, ridding our exercise bike and treadmill, moving the pop machine and reestablishing the vending area, adding a third bookcase for the lending library, and purchasing a new TV console, laptop, blue ray player, and quilt armoire.

Activities/services: 2014 was a year of firsts for SCOR, where we started offering new activities and services, such as Zumba, Creative Writing, Bunco, Pickleball and Healing Hearts Grief Support. We also organized our first National Senior Health Day and began our first Annual New Member Tea Party. Additionally, our lending library has been updated with a tracking system for new reading materials, and has been extended to include word puzzles, author requests, and a DVD Exchange.

Re-occurring Activities:

Many of our activities have been embraced by our members. Some activities are available at the discretion of our members, including pool, golf, table tennis and couponing. For our other recreational activities, we have composed a daily schedule that will allow everybody to enjoy them on a regular basis.

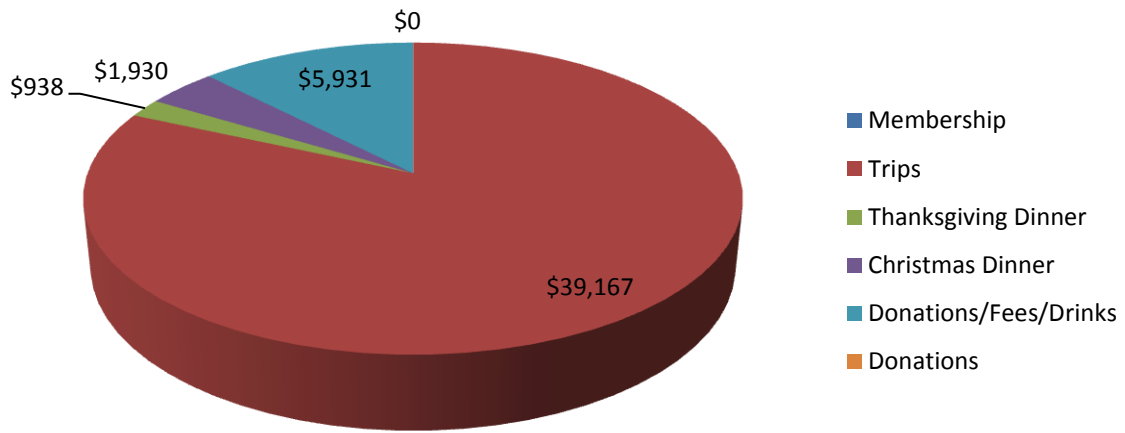
