Judy Doran remains as Director and Eileen Lawson is continuing as a part-time Assistant Director.

SCOR saw changes to the Board of Directors in 2015. They adopted a new name, Reynoldsburg Senior Citizens Association (RSCA). The new Board of Directors are: President, Sue Miller; Vice President, Nancy Spangler; Treasurer, Ed Slattery; and Secretary, Mary Theodoras. We look forward to their input in the years to come.

As an ever-changing facility, the SCOR building has undergone many modifications in order to improve the conditions for our members.

Building: January 8 SCOR was closed due to winter weather. A member accidentally drove his truck into and through the northwest door. The maintenance team boarded up the opening immediately and we reopened on January 12 with the doors boarded. The scheduled repair and painting of the interior walls began in February. Upon completion of the whole building paint, a kitchen fire occurred early morning on February 24. The building was again closed due to smoke and fire damage. Belfor was called in to manage the clean-up. We were able to open up for member events on March 12. Thanks to the persistence of our Parks and Recreation Director, Donna Bauman, the clean-up was complete before the end of the year. Aside from the internal renovations, we have also made exterior improvements. A group of volunteers scraped and painted the metal benches, cedar siding was replaced and painted on the south wall, overgrown shrubbery was removed from the west side, and signage describing the rain garden and pavement system were added on the northeast side of the building.

Activities/services: In an attempt to grow with an already technologically advanced society, in June of this year, Reynoldsburg Senior Citizens Association (RSCA) purchased a new web based software program, “My Senior Center”. This program allows the staff greater versatility with the database; mass calling on important events; event and trip scheduling; and, report creation using multiple variables. Because of these multiple features, we are gradually integrating the program into our daily operations. Along with “My Senior Center” came a computer kiosk for the members to sign-in using a key tag system. SCOR began the Key Tag Kick-off in September with a goal of having 95% participation within a year. SCOR continues to utilize our main room TV and hard wired laptop to project an informational PowerPoint that provides the daily schedule and important updates.

Re-occurring Activities:

Many of our activities have been embraced by our members. Some activities are available at the discretion of our members, including pool, golf, table tennis and couponing. For our other recreational activities, we have composed a daily schedule that will allow everybody to enjoy them on a regular basis.
